

Living in Tokyo, I have an image of Fukushima that is represented by paddy lands, peaches, and a lake (Inawashiro Lake).



## [My image of Fukushima]"FUKUSHIMA"

If you take a look of my work from above, you can see different colors of LEGO bricks representing three regions in Fukushima.

The white LEGO brick represents snow which symbolizes the Aizu region located in the far west of Fukushima. The green LEGO brick represents agriculture which symbolizes the Nakadori region located in the center of Fukushima. The red LEGO brick represents energy which symbolizes the Hamadori region located in the east of Fukushima where Fukushima nuclear power plants stand.


## [My image of Future]"Connection"

With a person and a door symbolizing future axially-aligned, I'm trying to express the state of the person who is facing both the future and the past. In the sides, land and ocean is shown.


