



Recovery Program by JRCS Fukushima Chapter

Five years have passed in March 2016 since the Great East Japan Earthquake and the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant accident occurred. Funded by the international donations from other sister Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies around the world, the Fukushima Chapter of the Japanese Red Cross Society has been providing various recovery programs with help of related groups/organizations. We organized and summarized the reasons why these activities were necessary, how they started and what kind of challenges emerged while providing these activities, as well as the data for the programs.



Links to websites/webpages run by the government or public corporations about nuclear disasters.





The IFRC developed its guidelines for National Societies to refer to it in preparing their own guidelines. The IFRC guidelines are also archived.




